# Sectional Champions



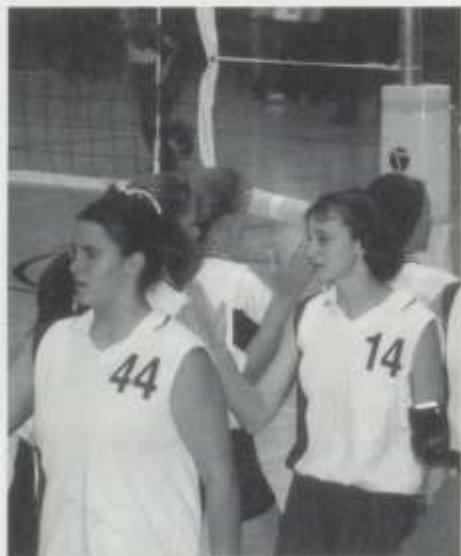

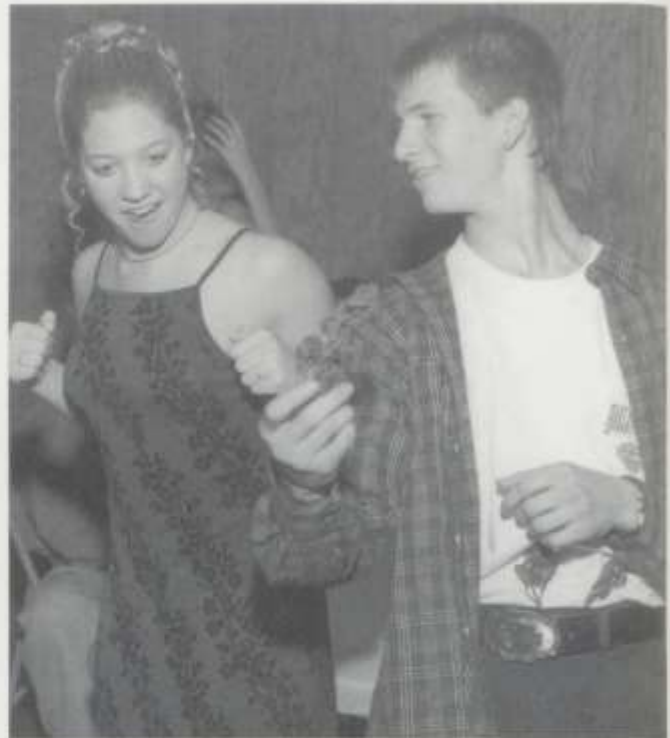

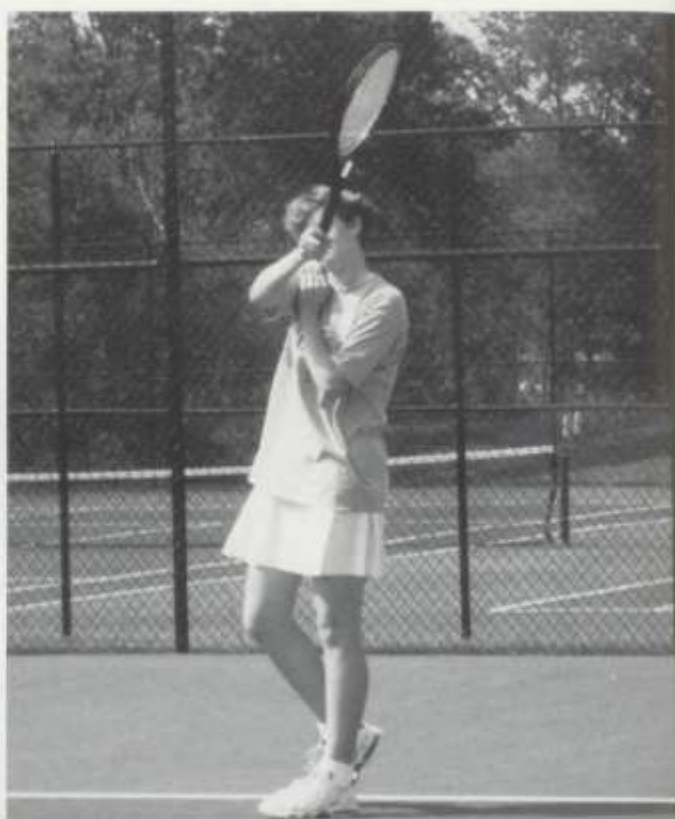

The team studied harder than ever, knowing that Kouts would be on their

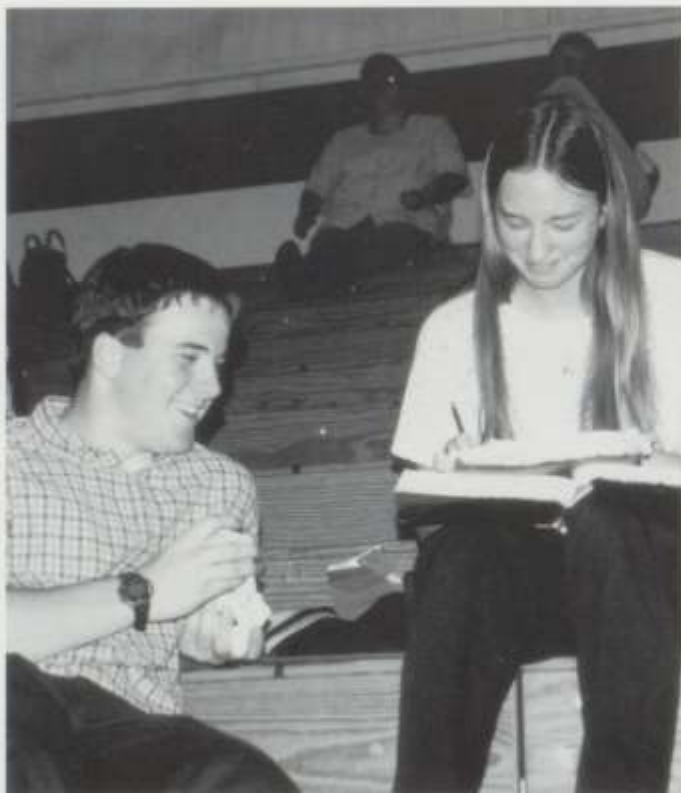
