The Library Club is sponsored by the school's librarian, Mrs. Beatrice Glezen. The members of this club assist the librarian during the school year.








The Wildcats recieved their initial taste of defeat in their second game of the season. The top-rated Tell City Marksmen came from behind to beat the fighting Cats 12-7.

Jasper ended a successful football campaign by winning their third in a row and seventh of the season as they clawed the Mount Vernon Vikings, 39-13.






EVENING IN PARIS

Jim Rees and Patty Clark were crowned King and Queen of the Prom by the junior class officers, Kent Fritch and Jane Stenftenagel.




