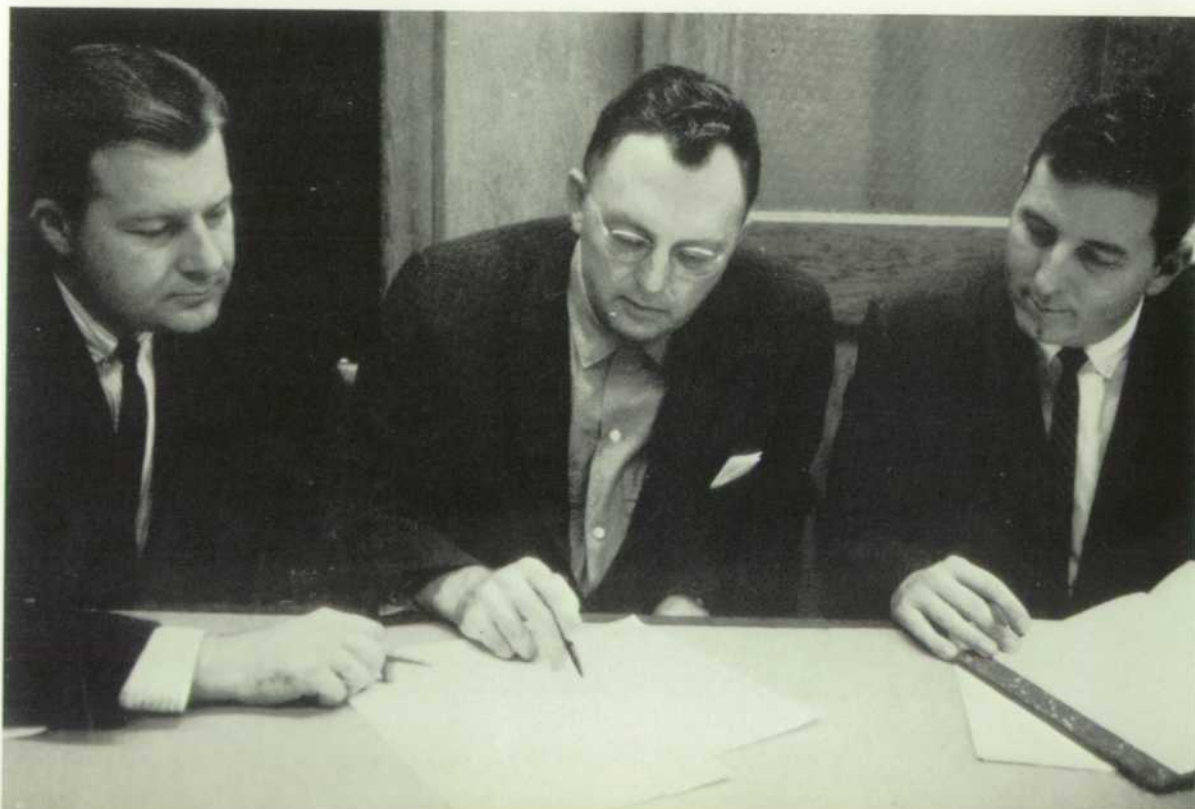

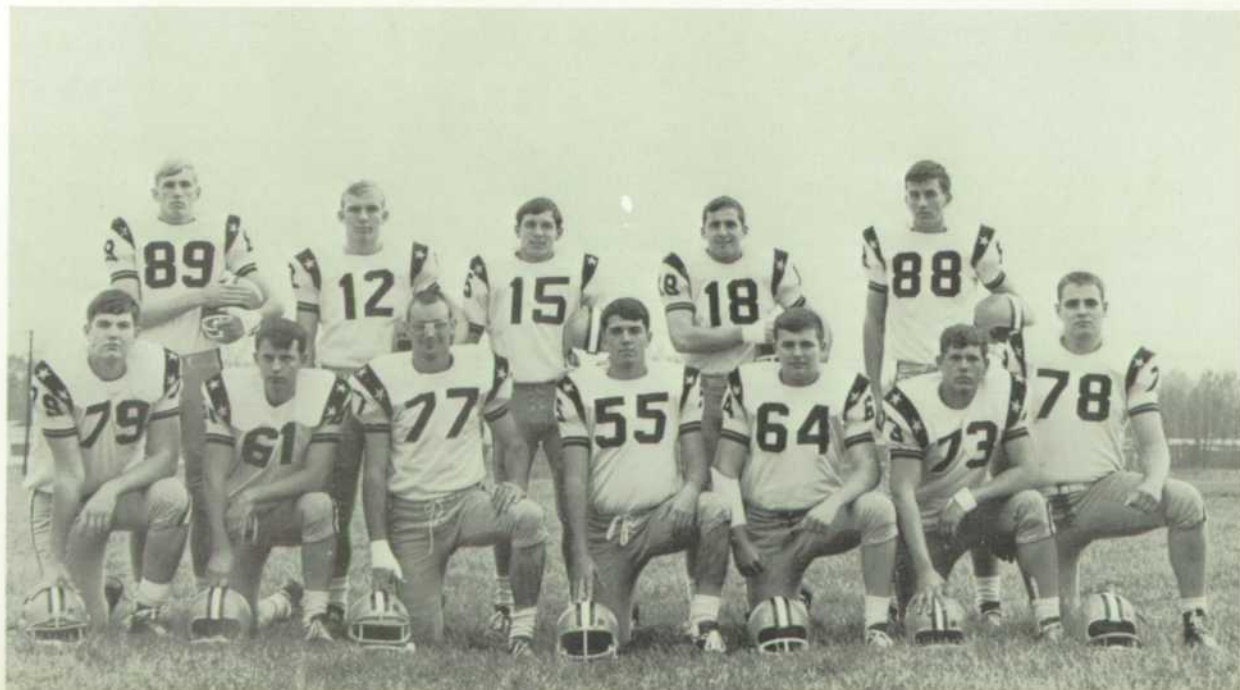
Next the Wildcats met Washington at rain soaked Alumni Stadium. The Hatchets punched over the lone TD of the game in the fourth quarter to break up a tough defensive battle and hung on to win 7-0. The Felines rebounded in their next game by beating a good Rex Mundi team by the score of 12-7. After the Evansville club had scored on the first play from scrimmage, Senior halfback Jerry Mehringer took the ensuing kickoff and thrilled the home crowd with an electrifying 91 yard scoring jaunt. That play proved to be the turning point of the season. Then the Wildcats journeyed to Boonville where they turned in another top notch effort by besting the Pioneers 14-6. In this game the Cats completely dominated a team that had crushed Tell City earlier in the year. Mitchell was the next club to feel the bite of the Cats as they thumped the host Bluejackets 33-0. Jasper followed this victory with a 20-7 win over underrated Princeton on Homecoming night. Salem proved to be no match the next week and fell easily 32-0.

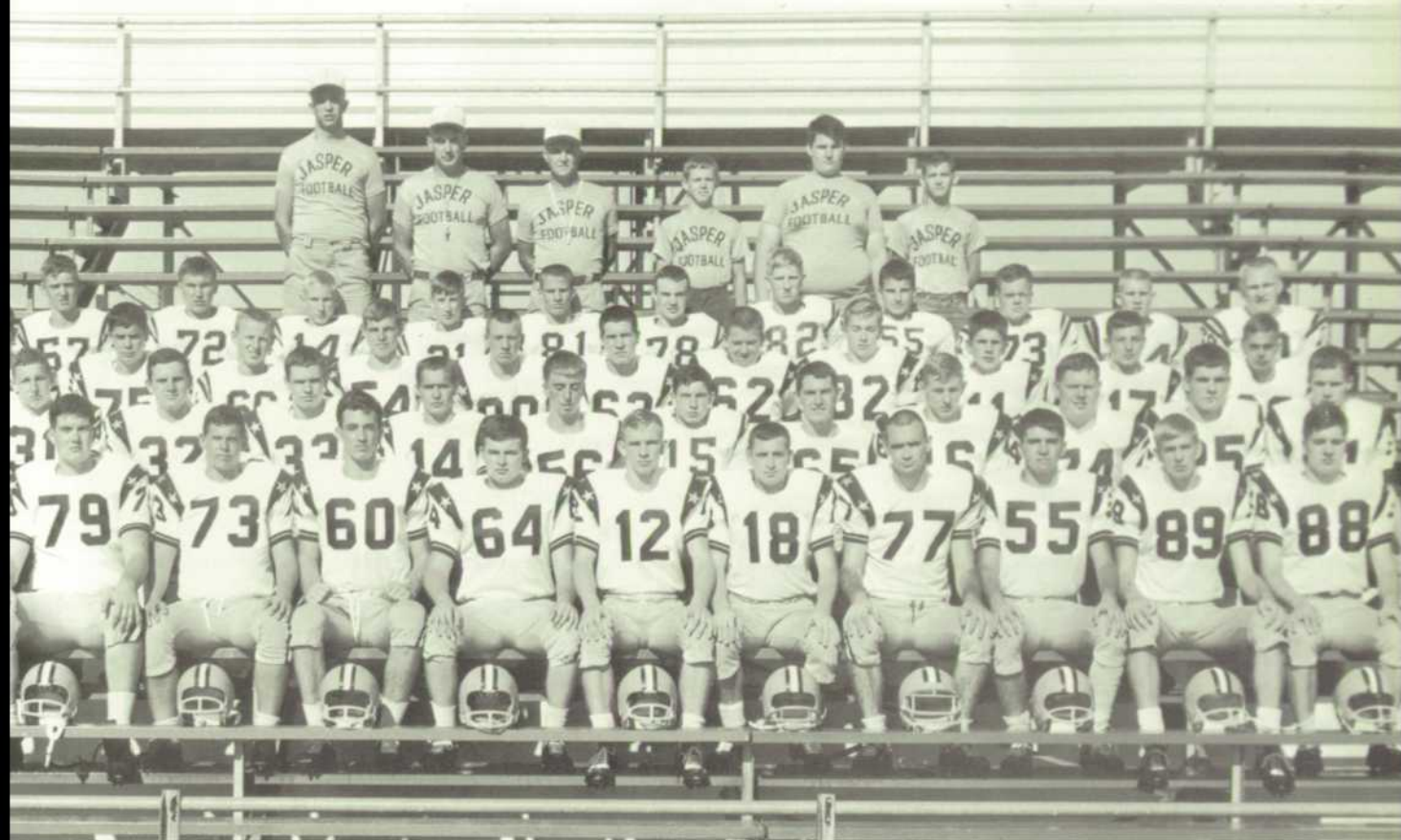
The Wildcats then rolled up their seventh consecutive victory as they whitewashed hard knocking Mt

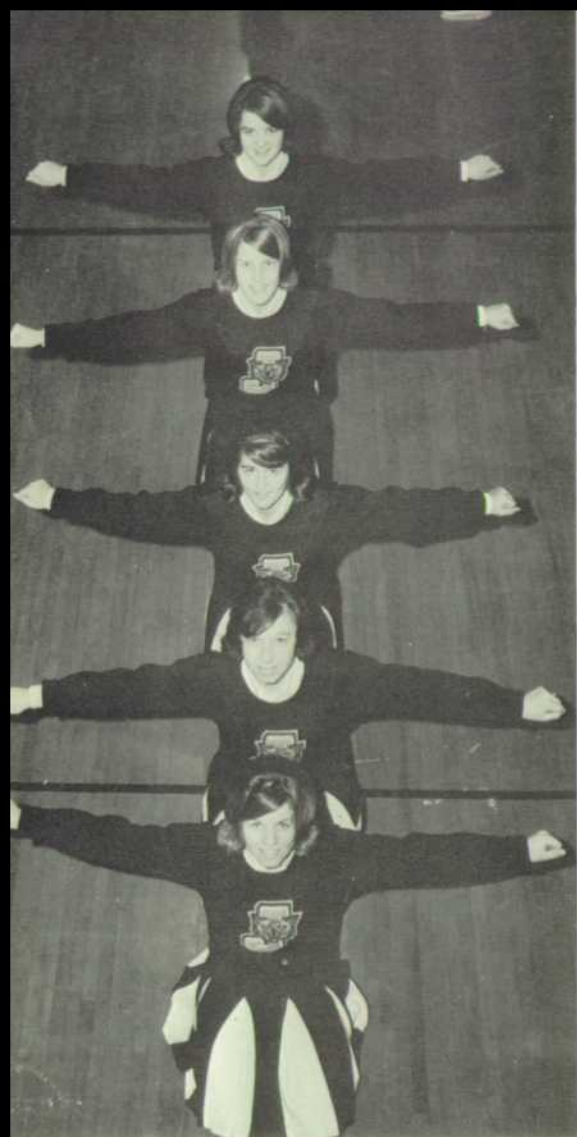

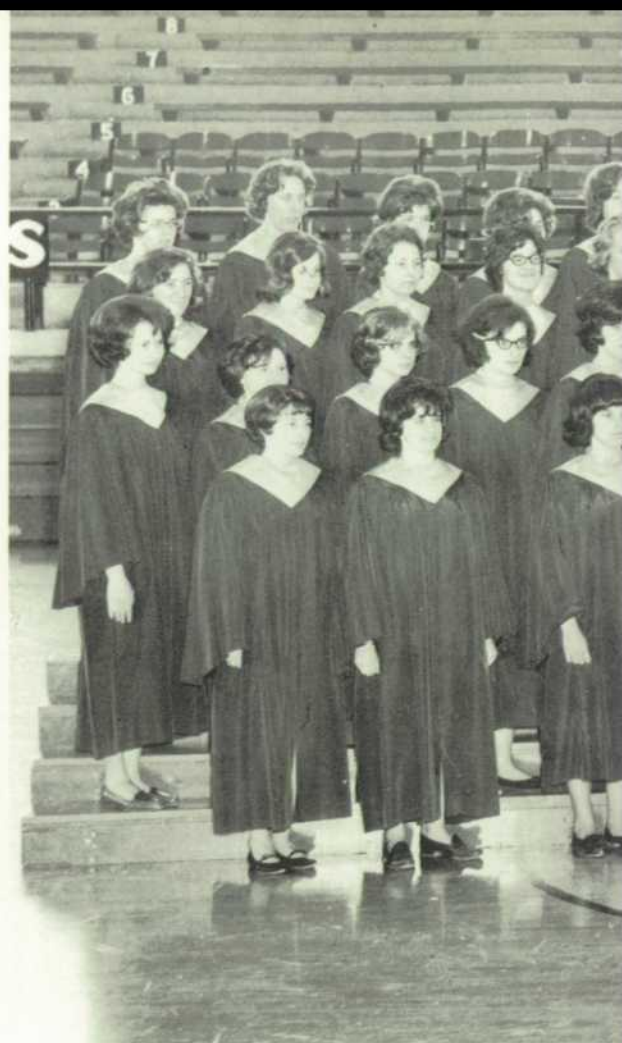

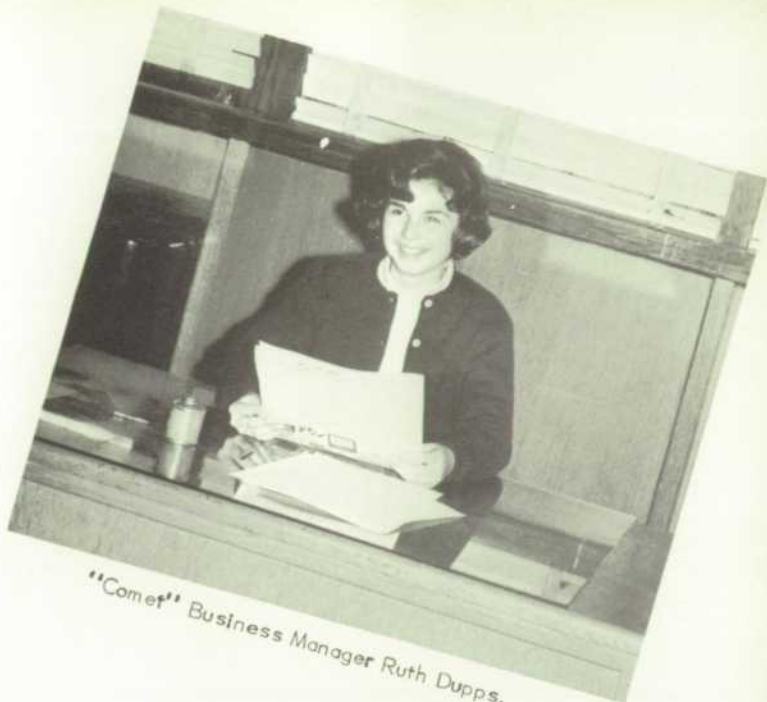

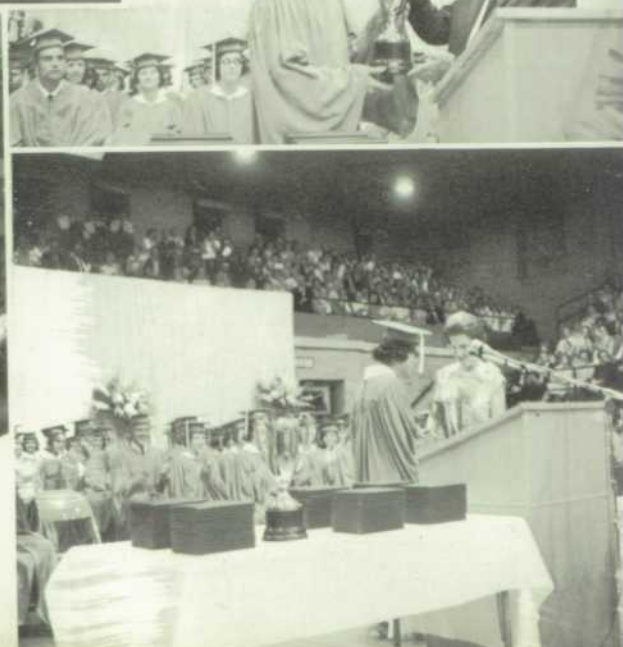
"The Many Loves of Dobie Gillis" was the title of this year's spring play. It is a three act comedy written by Max Shulman and dramatized by William F. Davidson.
