



We think too many people live without questioning life. Therefore, we hope this yearbook will make you stop and think, "Just what is the key to life?"





Tom's death was a real jolt to our class. We realized that something was missing from our class, someone was gone. We shall always remember Tom as he was, a friend to all.













Wildcats Grab Second Straight SIAC Championship

"The greatest team in the school's history!"
Those were the words Coach Jerry Brewer used to describe the 1967 Jasper Wildcat Football Team. Along with finishing the season with the sparkling 9-1 record which gave them the SIAC "B" division championship, the Wildcats had the honor of being the highest scoring team in Indiana with 413 points, while giving up only 54 points to their opponents.

The Cats got off to a perfect start in early September by defeating the Bedford Stonecutters 20-0. The following week Jasper shut out archival Tell City at Alumni Stadium 21-0. Jasper's "gridiron 11" extended their winning streak to three in a row by upending the Washington Hatchets 51-7.

Rex Mundi thwarted Jasper's attempt for an undefeated season by scoring with seconds remaining in the game and handed the Wildcats their first and only loss of the season 21-10.


With revenge in their eyes and the desire for victory in their hearts, the Cats outscored their next two opponents 109-12. Jasper defeated Boonville 48-6 and Mitchell 61-6.

The following week the JHS eleven emerged from a game played in mud, rain, and dense fog, the victors over Princeton 20-7 and broke the school's scoring record by defeating the Castle Knights 68-7 a week later.

The true test of the Wildcats came on the evening they played Mount Vernon, the only other team in hot contention for the SIAC crown. Again Jasper dominated the play to win the game 42-0 and the "B" division championship for the second year in a row.

In the final game of the football season the Wildcats played arch-rival Huntingburg. Dominating all statistics of the game, Jasper completed its championship season with a thorough 62-0 victory over the Happy Hunters.




Following a loss to State Finalist Vincennes, Ed Schultheis and his team put together two solid victories in the next games by defeating North Knox and Tell City.






