
They concluded the concert season with a concert tour to Rensselaer and Chicago,


RECORD WON - 6 LOST - 1

'49 STATE CHAMPS RETURN FOR CELEBRATION 1948-1949 — 1973-74





Summarily dismissed as contenders on the basis of a lack-luster season (11-9), they proceeded to set Indiana on its ear by winning it all. The manner in which they achieved this pinnacle--by coming from behind in eight of their ten tournament triumphs--completely captivated Hoosierland's basketball fans.

It is fitting then, that the principle actors in that ten-part drama back in 1949 be honored during this Silver Anniversary year of the memorable feat!

This page is reserved for commemorating that great moment and that great team. On December 8th the '49 team was honored in pregame ceremonies in which all team members were present and recognized. The coaches of that illustrious team gave comments of the historic moment and received gifts while the players received keys to the city of Jasper. 








TRACK '74

The above divisions are the manufacturing operations of The Jasper Corporation in Jasper. The service divisions located here are the General Office, Research & Development, Creative Arts Design Center, Property Management, Data Processing and Traffic.

Other company facilities in Jasper are Kimball Music Center, a retail outlet for Kimball Pianos and Organs, and H. R. J. Automotive Services, Inc., a complete

automotive service center.
