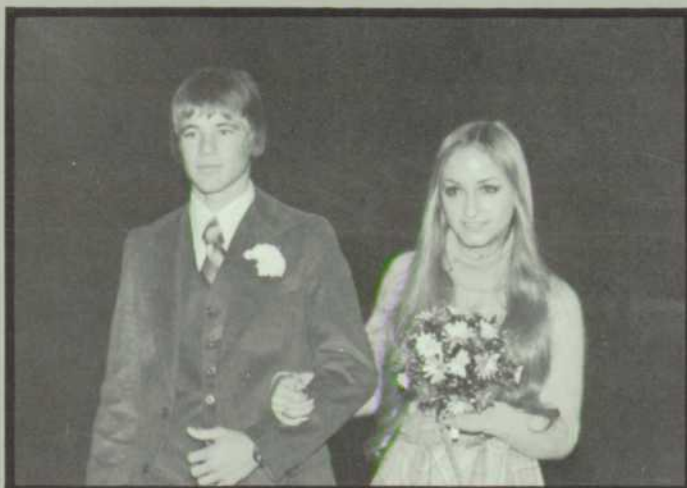
HOMECOMING

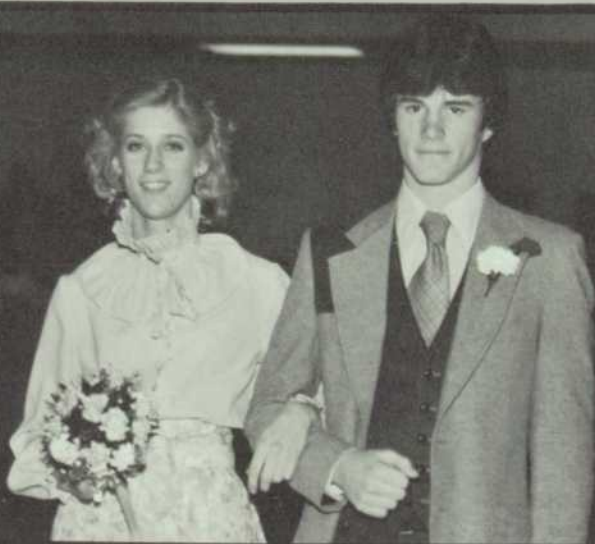

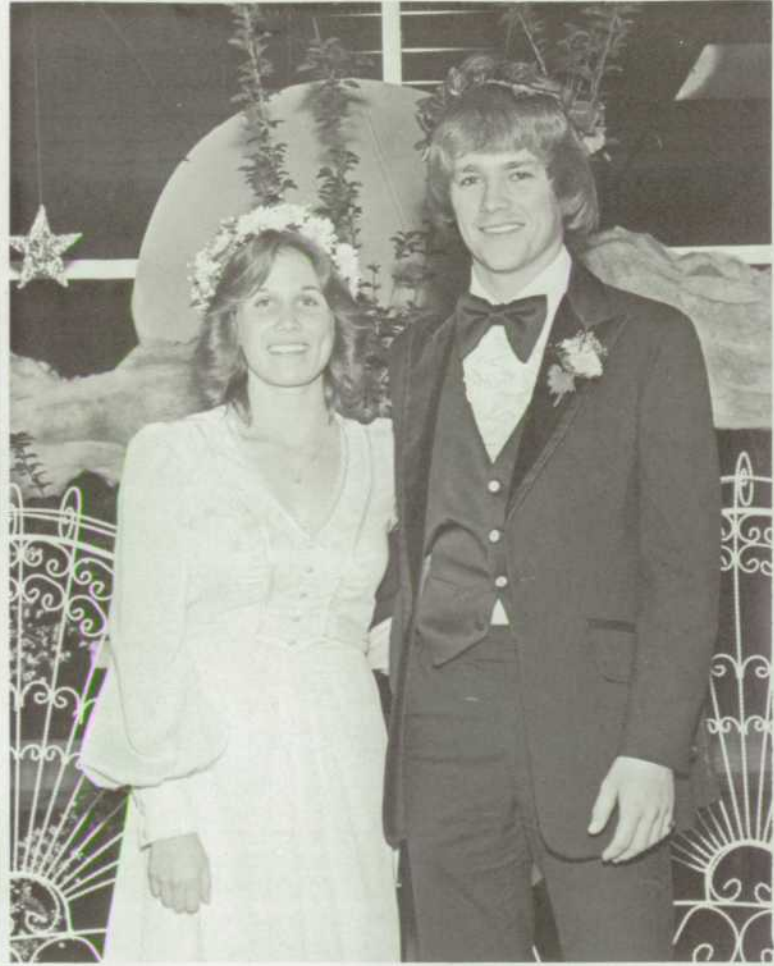
Music was provided by the band "August Heet". The huge success of the affair was accented by the soft music and romantic atmosphere. The hard work of several clubs made this occasion possible.

The JHS Band has done well under its new directors, Gary and Samantha Fields. The "Marching Cats" placed eleventh at the Indiana State Fair.

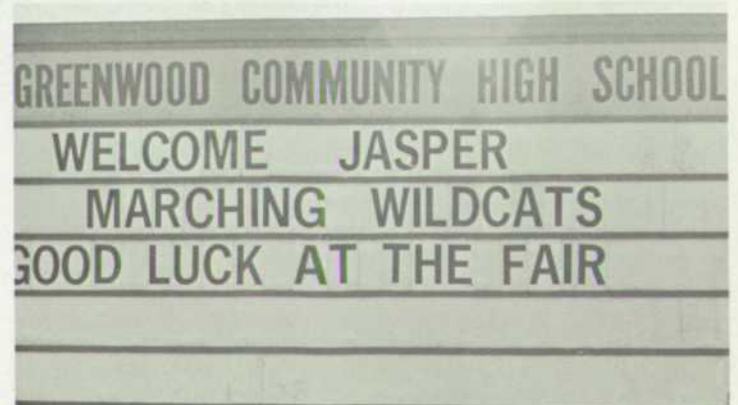

The reserves also tasted victory throughout the season. They completed a perfect 13-0 season for the second year in a row.



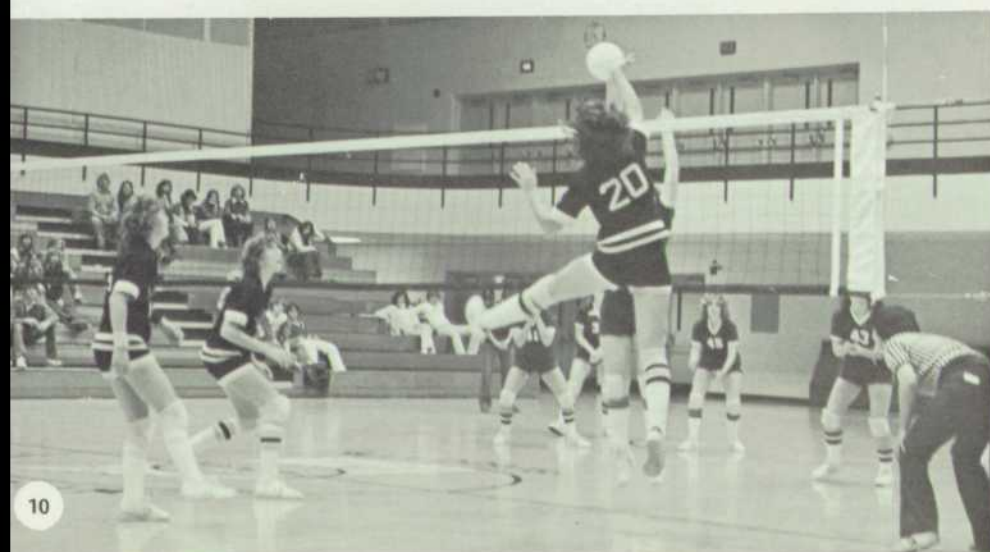

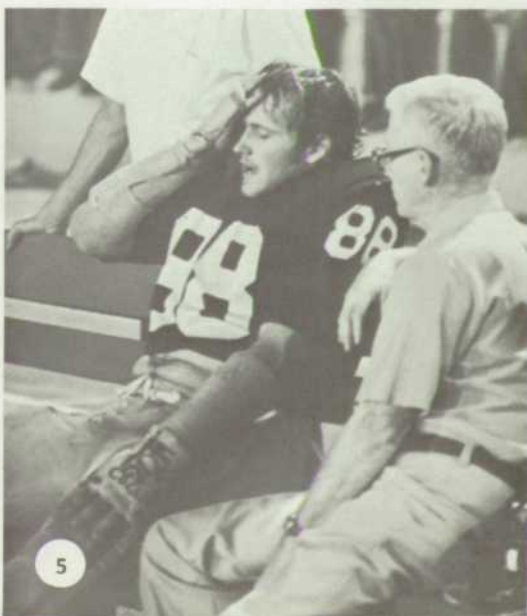

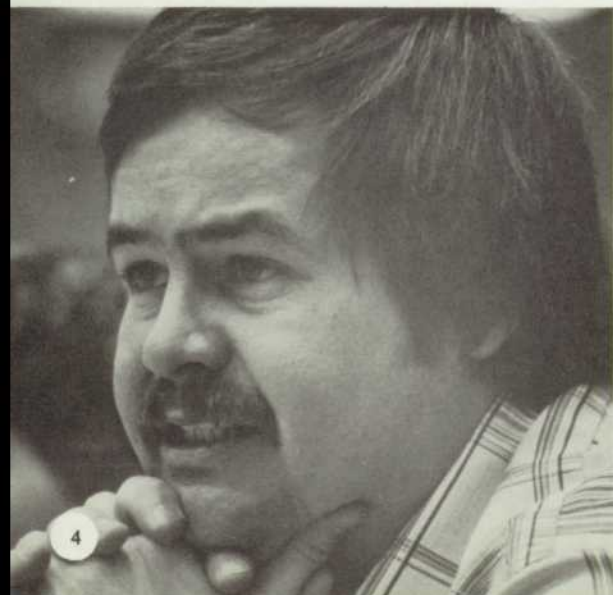

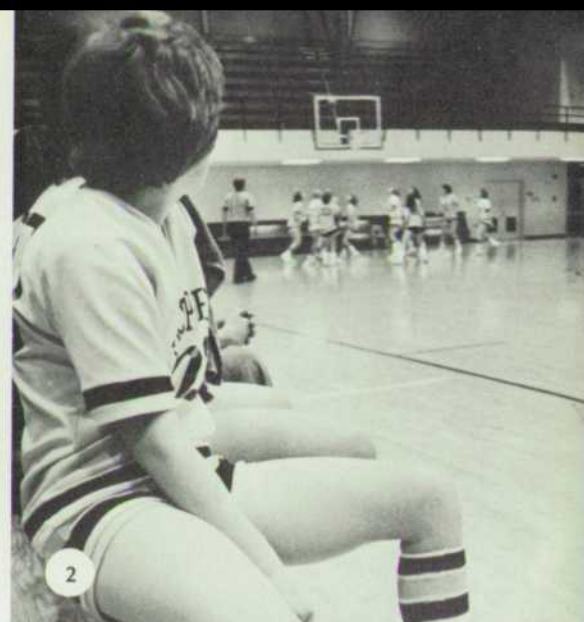

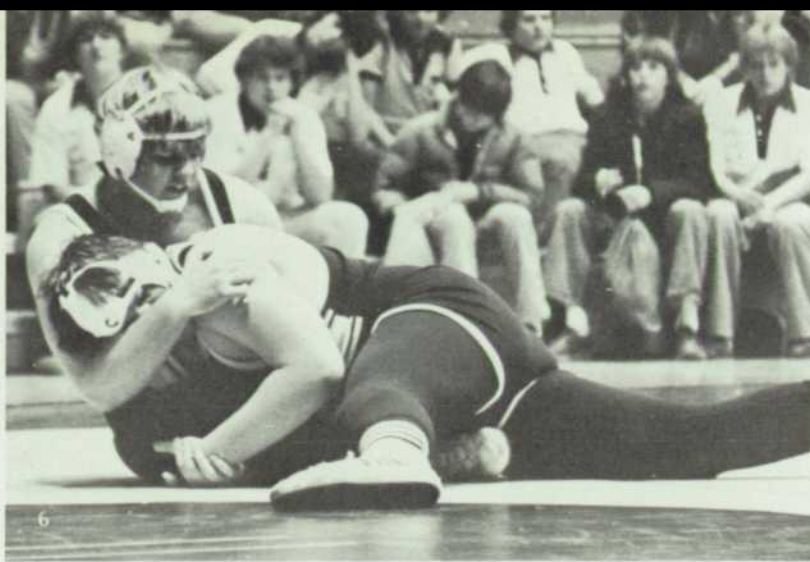
WRESTLING

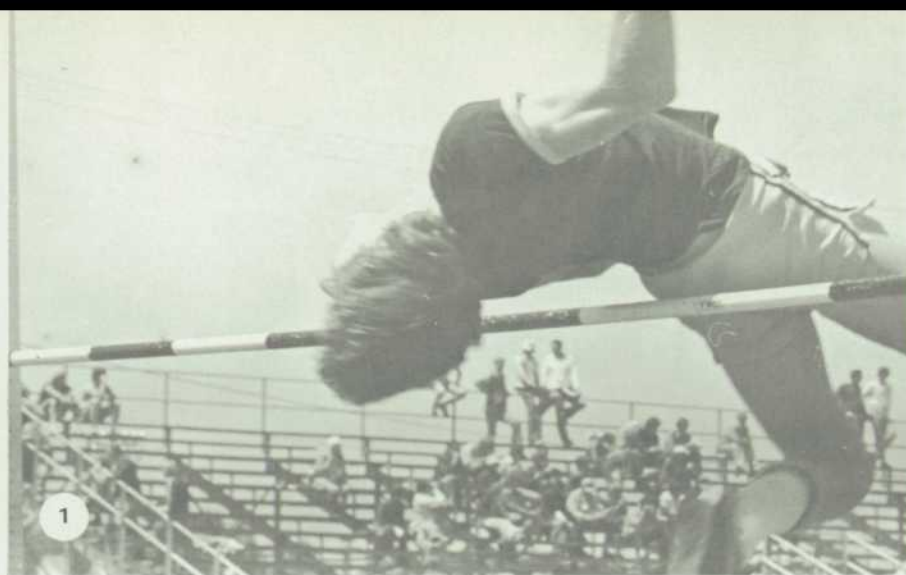
TRACK

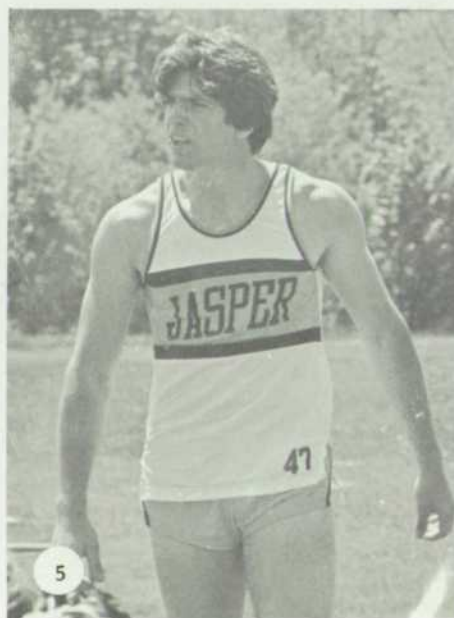
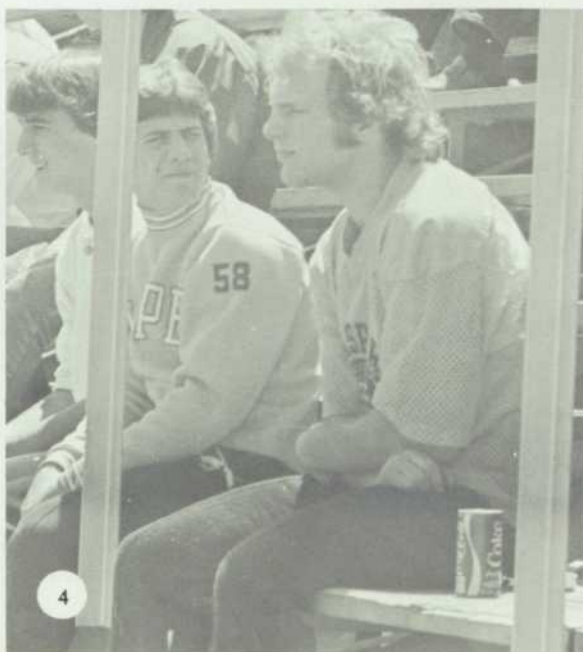

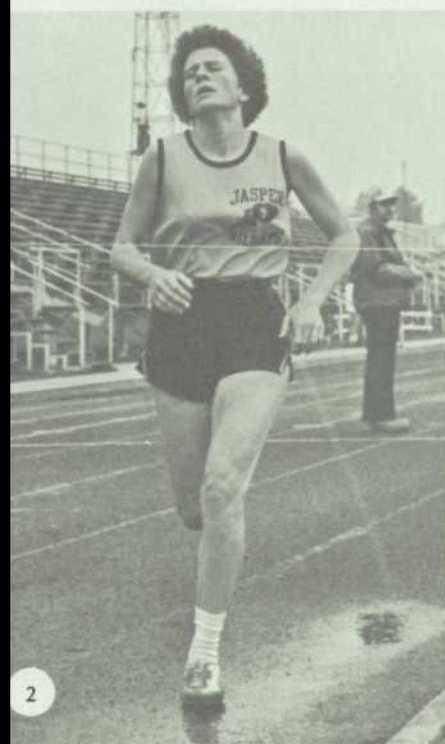


GIRLS' TRACK

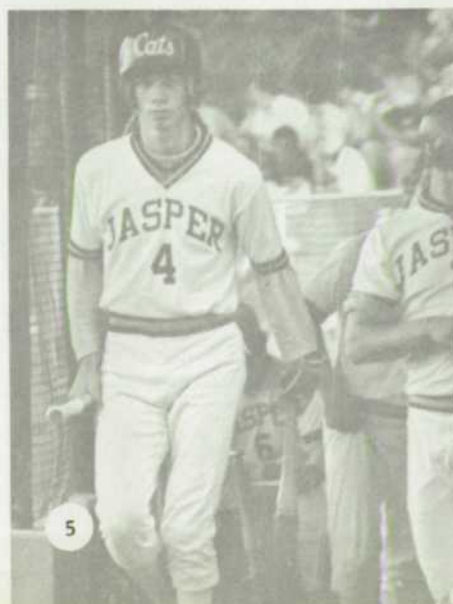

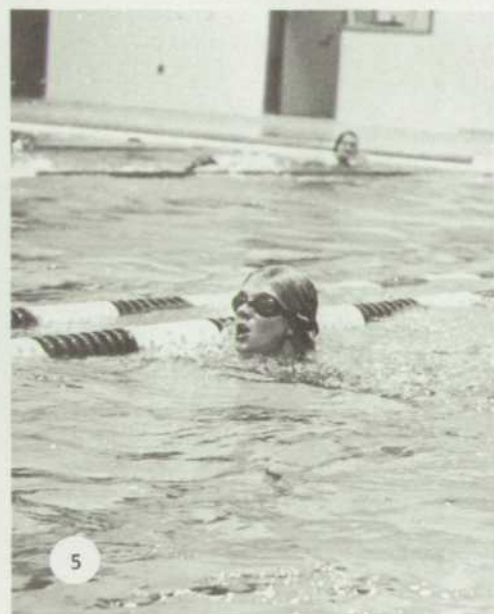
