
HOMECOMING







Music was provided by the band "August Heet". The huge success of the affair was accented by the soft music and romantic atmosphere. The hard work of several clubs made this occasion possible.


















STATE FINALS

The underclassmen also had a successful year. They won the Jasper Frosh-Soph Invitational and the SIAC-AA title.










