

The Class of 1987 will always remember May 22, 1987, as a special moment in their lives, and they shall look to the future to continue their success.













### Wildcats have a conference!









### Goodbye, Mr. Lythgoe:




As Mr. Lythgoe leaves us, we have fond memories of all he has done. We wish him well in his retirement years. We thank him!


### SADD




# Marching Band

The Comet newspaper staff was taught the skills of journalism by Mr. Larry LaGrange. The production of the Comet, five issues of 16-20 pages each this year, was carried out through class assignments. Each staff member wrote two or three stories to be considered for each issue. School related stories featured students and teachers, curriculum changes, the German students from Faust Gymnasium who visited a month, and sports stories. Local businesses placed ads; many offered discount coupons.

Income from ads and sales—50¢ per issue,—and profits from a January 17th dance were used to buy camera equipment and other supplies, and to pay for costs of field trips.

The American Scholastic Press Association voted the Comet a first place rating, and the Indiana High School Press Association ranked the paper "outstanding." The Herald recognized writers for their best articles at the Awards Day program in May. The Comet's staff was excellent, if small, this year, and its professional-looking newspapers kept the school and community well informed.
