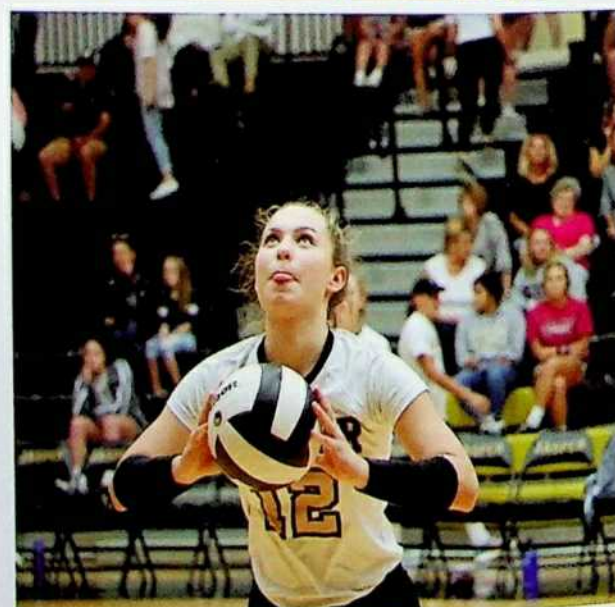

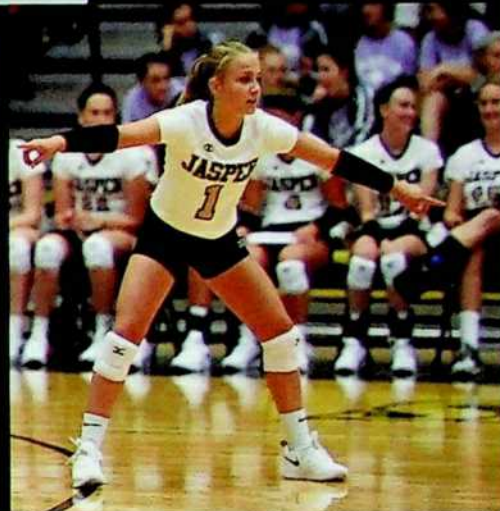

Hours spent on the court together allowed the boys to become more united over the season. "...we hang out after tennis too and we're really good friends," said sophomore Bennet Schmitt.



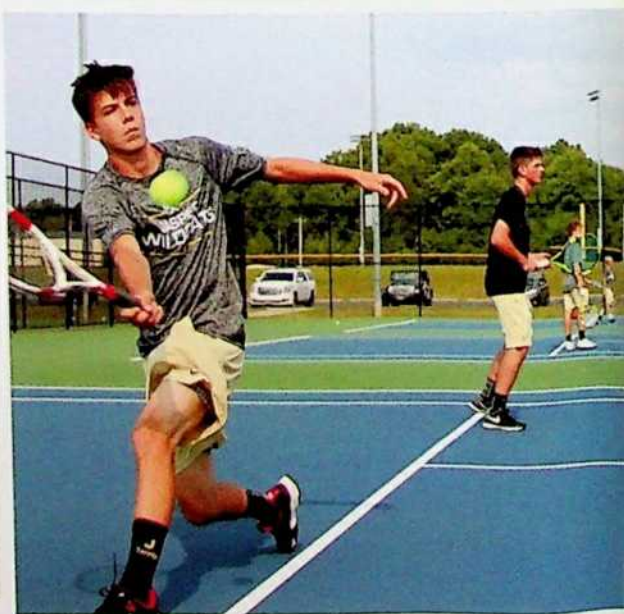
Eli Franks, senior, focuses on the movement of his opponent during his match against Terre Haute Vigo High School. Franks also signed to play tennis at Bellarmine University

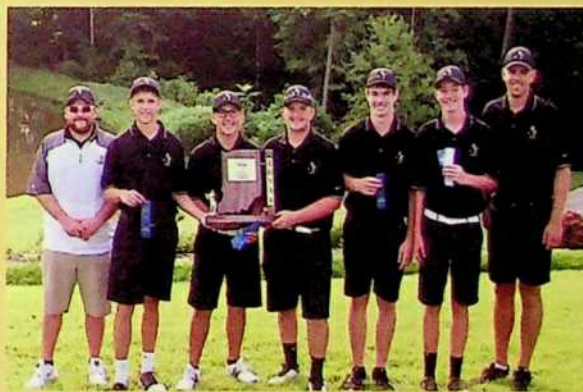

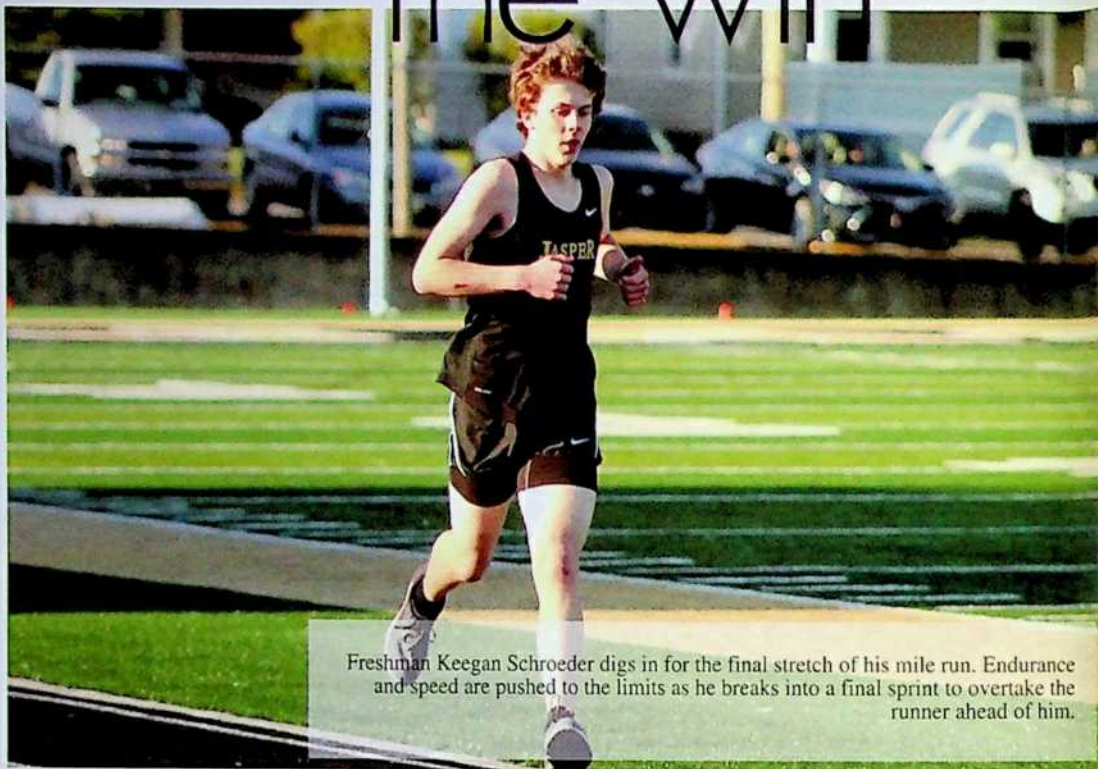

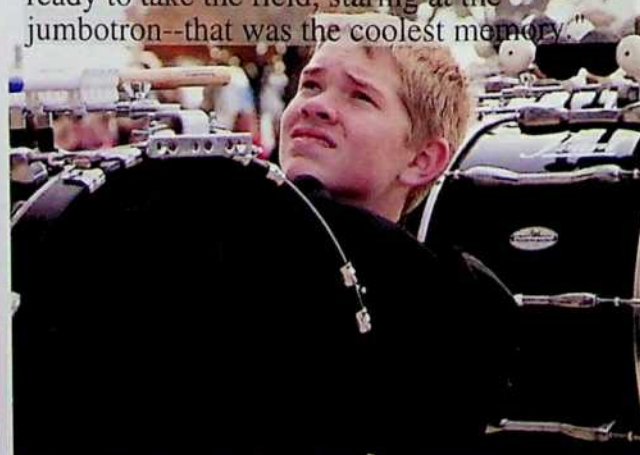

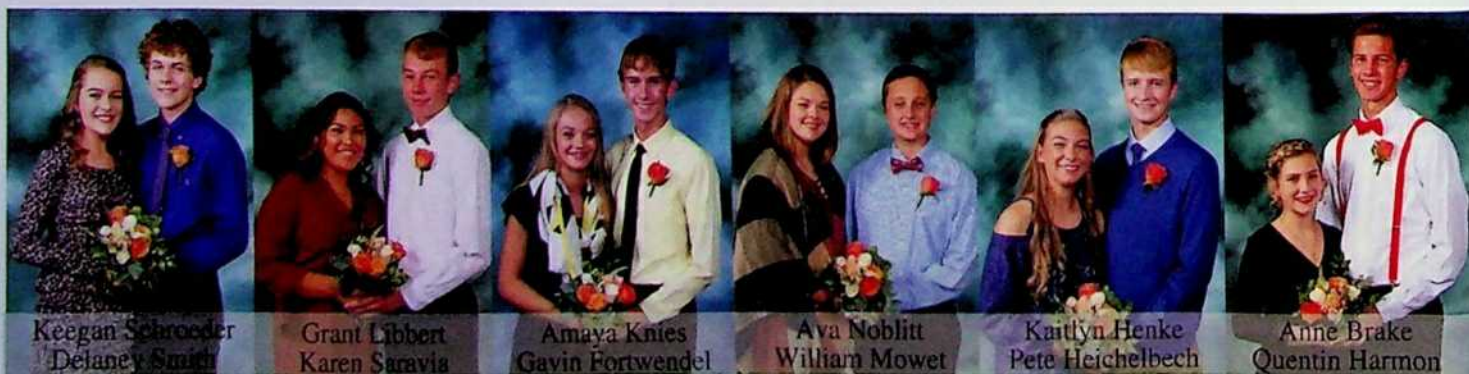




Home Sweet Homecoming

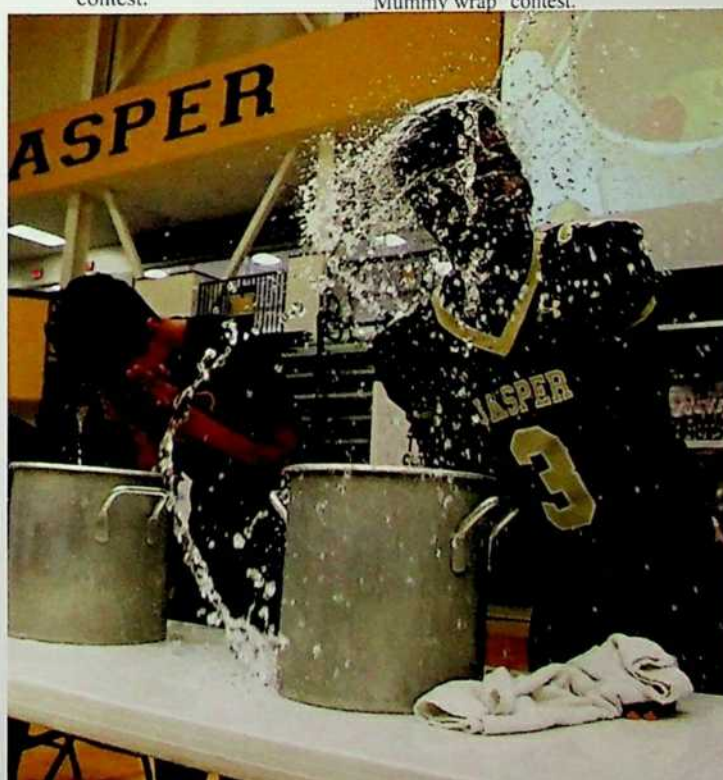

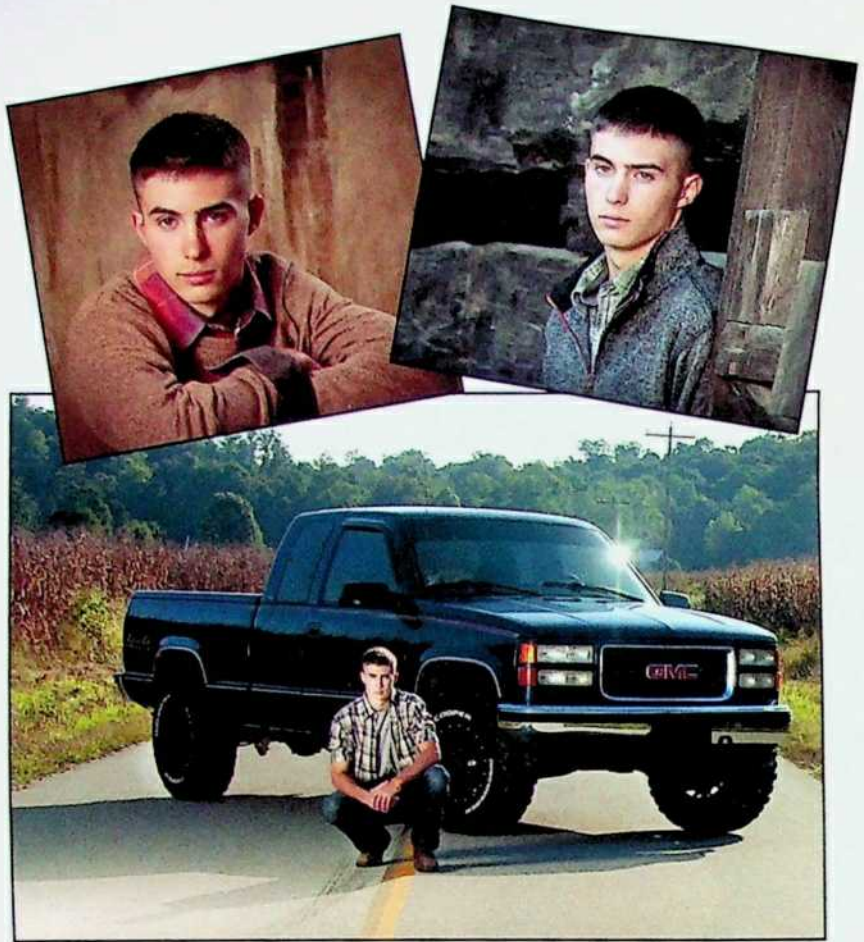


Mr. James Goodhue
