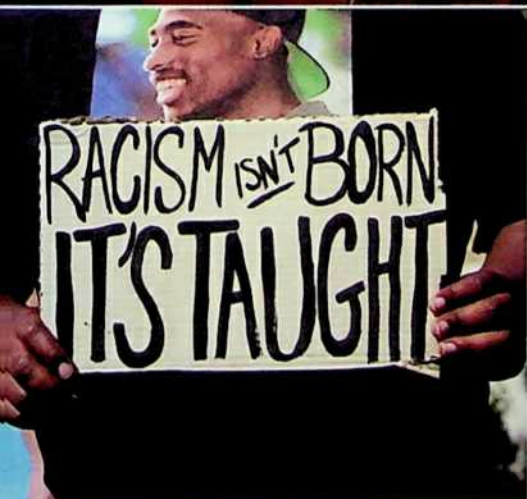
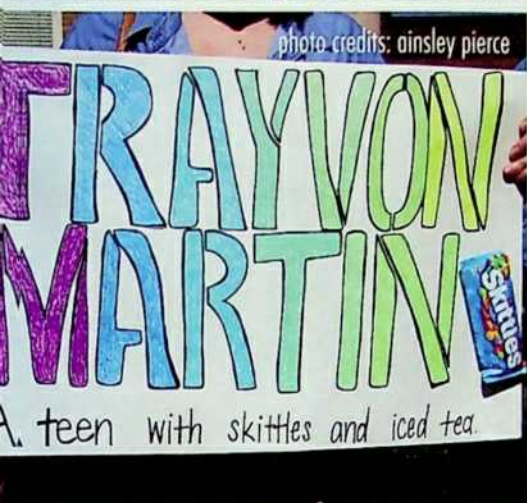
BLACK LIVES MATTER PROTESTS

MAY 25

George Floyd, an African American man, is killed by a police officer who knelt on his neck during an arrest after a store clerk suspected he may have used a counterfeit \$20 bill in Minneapolis.

MAY 27

Protests spark all across the country; some are peaceful, but many cause violence and are met with retaliation from armed forces.

MAY 29

Derek Chauvin, the Minnesota police officer who knelt on George Floyd's neck, is arrested and charged with murder and manslaughter.

JUNE 8

The George Floyd Justice in Policing Act is proposed to combat police misconduct, excessive force, and racial bias. (The act was approved by the House on March 3, 2021).

MARCH 13

Breonna Taylor is shot by Louisville police officers during a drug raid in her boyfriend's apartment. The #SayHerName campaign begins.

MAY 26

Protests in Minneapolis begin to call for justice for Mr. Floyd's death. The Minneapolis Police Department fires the four officers involved in the incident.

MAY 28

Protests spread internationally, including Liberia and Nigeria. The United States National Guard are deployed in major cities due to large protests in the United States.

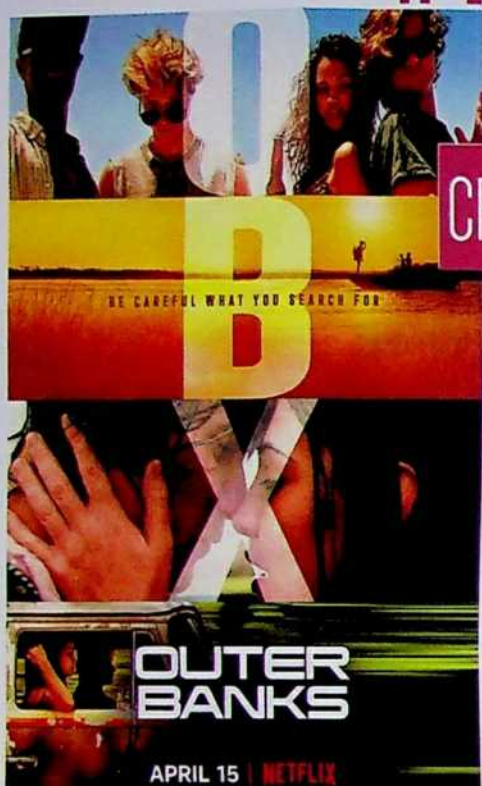
JUNE 3

Senate Bill 217 is introduced to require that police wear body cameras and release the footage to the public after any incidents; it also repeals the "fleeing felon rule" that bans choke holds. The other three officers in the Floyd case are charged with second-degree murder.

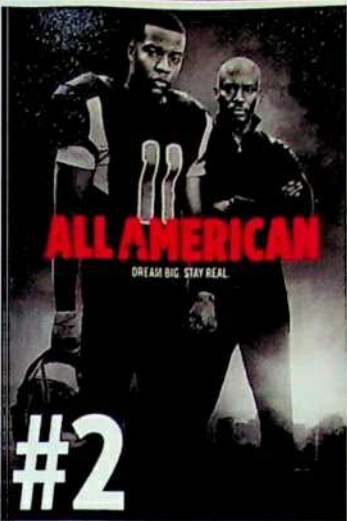

A LONG-AWAITED back to school



SENIOR TAILGATE

Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, annual traditions are still being honored by Jasper students. Every year the senior class gets together in the band parking lot before class on the first day of school. Donuts and conversations drifted around the students. This year was especially memorable as most seniors have not seen their classmates since in-class education was halted in early March.



TEMPERATURE CHECKS

On March 13, 2020, Mr. Wilson announced over the speakers that the Greater Jasper Consolidated School Corporation was going to be virtual for the next 4 weeks. Unfortunately, school remained virtual for the rest of the year due to a lock down implemented by the Indiana Governor, Eric Holcomb. For the coming school year, changes needed to be made in order to make school COVID-safe. For starters, each student has to wear a mask and get their temperature scanned by a teacher when they walk into the building. To allow teachers plenty of time to arrive at school and prepare for this, Jasper High School has made a big change. In previous years, some students would arrive at school early to finish homework or prepare for tests. Now, if a student wants to come in before 7:30, the only door open is the front entrance. In their classrooms, teachers removed extra desks and spread the remaining desks out to minimize contact tracing. Another change to the school day is the implementation of a third lunch. Because students have to sit every-other-seat, there wasn't enough space in the cafeteria for roughly 500 students in each lunch period. What many students don't know is that this isn't the first time JHS has had three lunches. In the early 2000's, Jasper High School began using the three-lunch system. "I think it was about 2008-2009 it switched back to two lunches," Mrs. Luebbehusen explains the changes that were made when she was relatively new to Jasper High School, "Principal Hacker is the one who switched it back to two lunches." With all the big changes, the 2020-2021 school year is going to be one for the books.

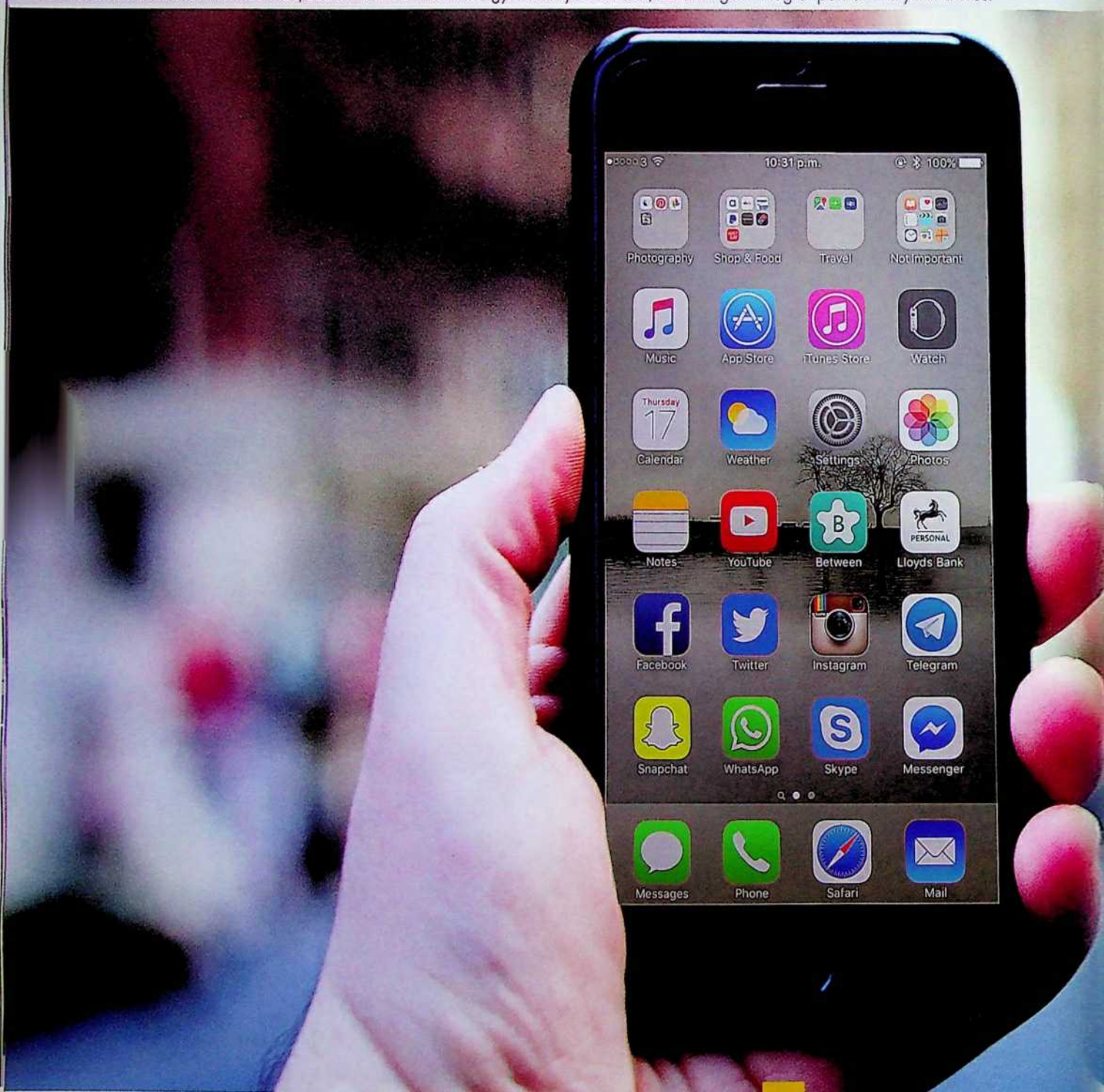

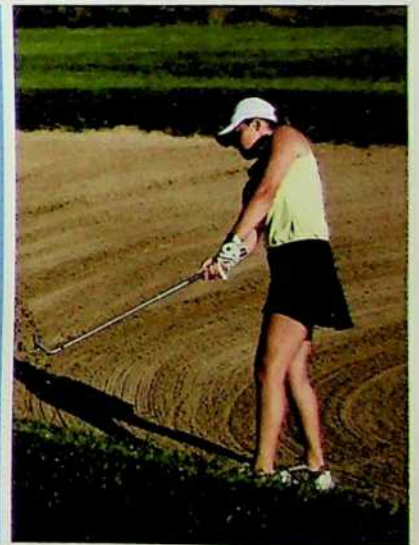
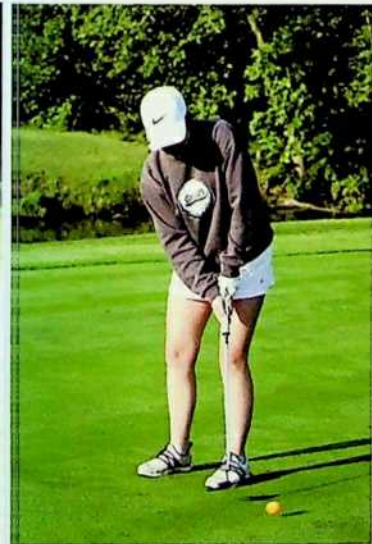
ON PAR SEASON

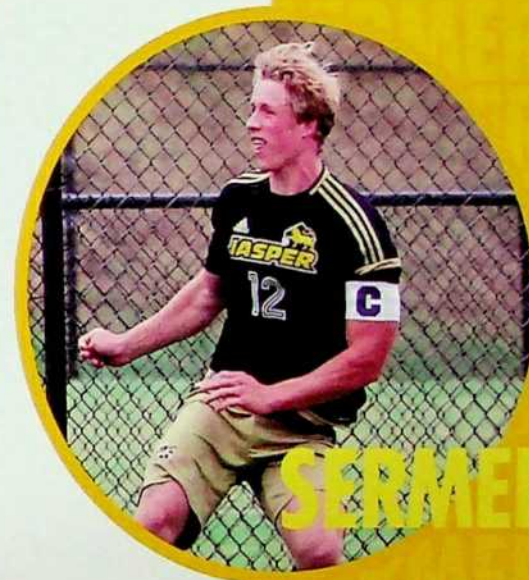

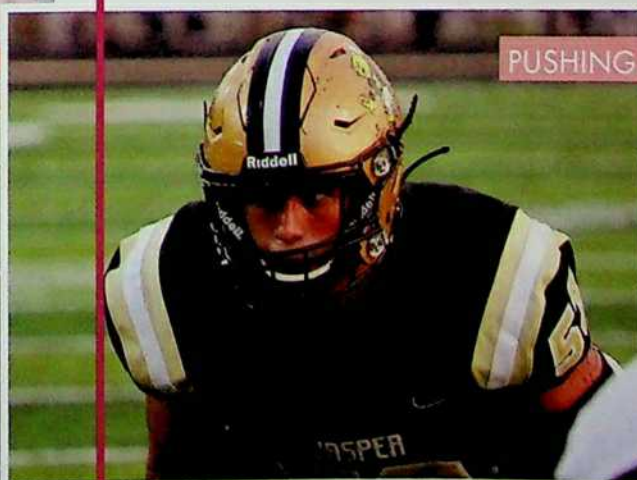
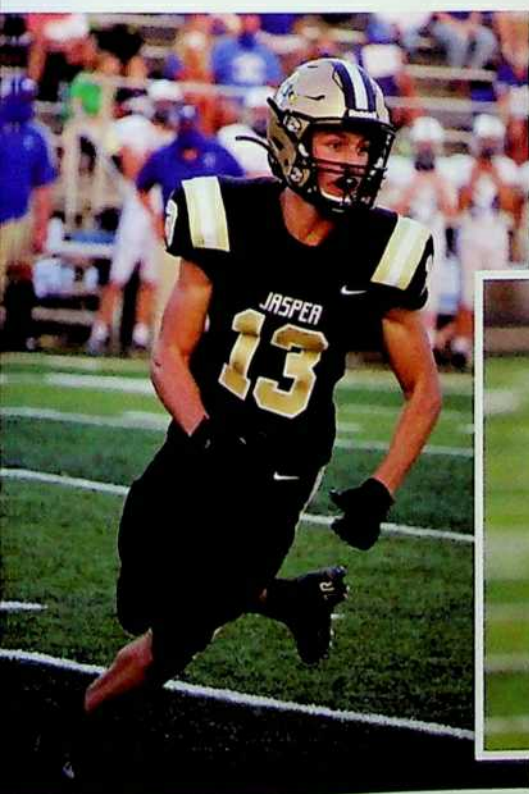
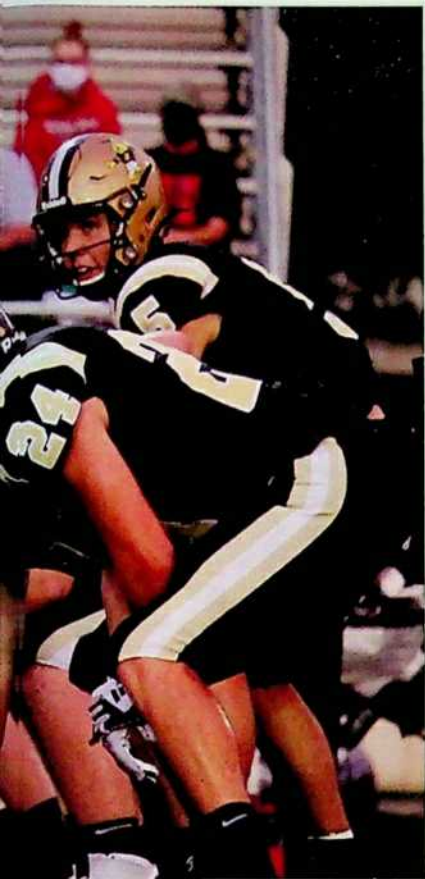


SIAC A CHANGE IN COMPETITION

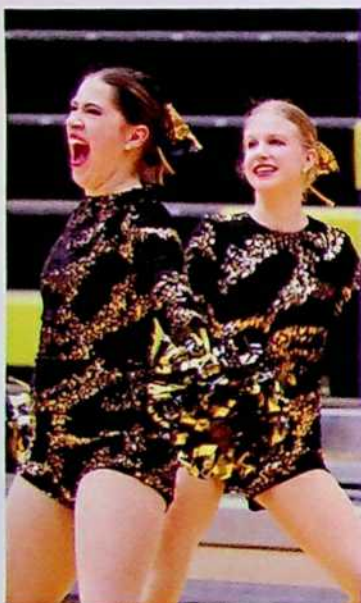

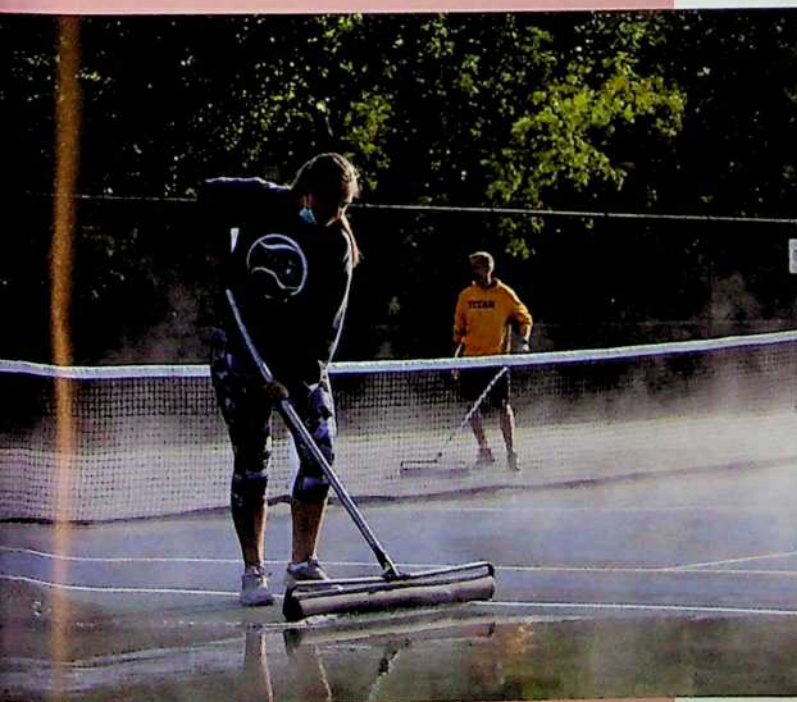

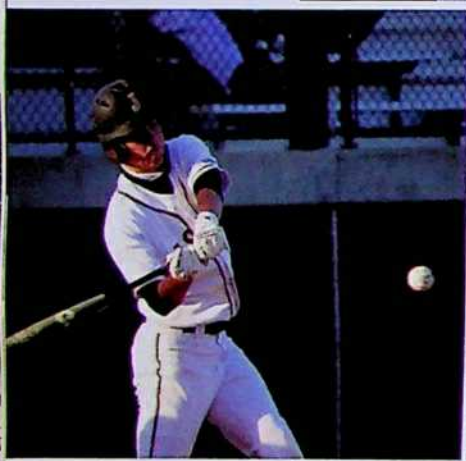


WALKING THE COURSE

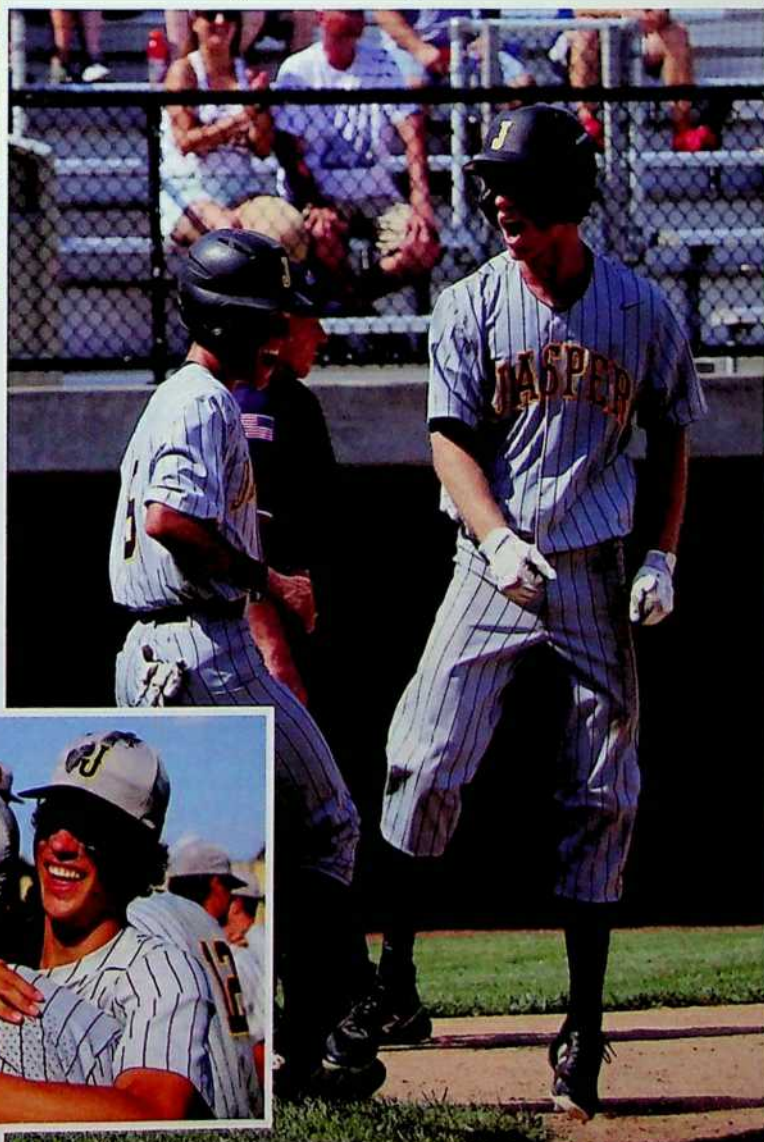

Burger later dove into home plate after an error by the second baseman. Junior Connor Foley was next up to bat and rocketed a ball into left field for a ground rule double, advancing runners to second and third bases. Jasper finished up after senior catcher Ross Peter hit a double, driving Foley and senior Eli Hopf home for two runs. Fishers's only run came in the fifth inning after Jasper managed to prevent further scoring. The game ended in the top of the seventh inning when Jasper caught a ball out in left field for their third and final out of the game.



CHAMPIONS

Jasper baseball was an underdog all season. Due to COVID-19, the Jasper baseball team was not able to have a true season in 2020. Many believed that Jasper would not go very far in the state tournament in 2021, much less win the state championship. However, the Wildcats managed to not only win the tournament but also finish with a record of 31-2. This season was Jasper baseball's first year back in the Southern Indiana Athletic Conference (SIAC), and they managed to win the conference title undefeated. Jasper also managed to beat other notable teams such as Brebeuf and rival, Southridge. Southridge had several exceptional players, including Colson Montgomery who was drafted to play for the Chicago White Sox over the summer, and Jasper still managed to outplay them in a nailbiter for a final score of 4-3. Jasper then went on to win their first sectional game against nemesis, Castle (6-1) and moved on to play Evansville North. The game against Evansville North was considered by many to be the toughest game in the IHSAA Sectional Tournament, and Jasper managed to narrowly win that game (5-4). Jasper finished up with a run-ruled victory vs Evansville Central (10-0) for the sectional title. Jasper then went on to beat Floyd Central and Center Grove to win the regional title. Many believed Jasper would have a tough time beating Mt. Vernon Fortville in the semi-state championship, but that offensive fire power and exceptional defense showed up again, as they won through the run-rule with a massive score of 17-2. Jasper finished up their true underdog season with their 6th state title against the Fishers' Tigers with a score of 3-1.
